Curriculum Evenings

Thank you to all of those who attended the Curriculum Evenings this year. If you were unable to attend, a copy of the presentations can be found on the class pages of the school website. Some key messages were:

Homework:

Please see the 'Home Learning Policy' on the school website for details of the homework that is expected. We do not set a lot of homework at Whitegate (apart from Y6 as we are preparing the children for SATs and for high school readiness). We do expect all children from Y1 to Y6 to read at least 4 times a week and to spend time on Numbots or TTRS for at least 15 minutes per week. If children have not completed these tasks, we will ask them to catch up during social times. This is not a punishment but to ensure that children's progress is not inhibited. As our policy says, children whose reading is not supported by adults at home do not make the same good progress as their peers. Reading impacts on children's achievement in all other subjects.

Calculation Policy:

If you are unsure how to support your child in mathematics, please have a look at our calculation policy which can be found on the school website. As explained, we are planning to carry out workshops for parents in the spring term to support you with this.

School Calendar:

At the time of the Curriculum Evenings, this had not been populated. Mrs Winnington has now added the dates for the rest of this term, so please do take a look to see what is coming up. Educational Visits:

As explained, we are currently working with the governors to review procedures, for educational visits, including residentials, and communication will be released soon regarding this area.

Chat Groups:

Please do not allow your children to use WhatsApp and Messenger to chat with their friends. These sites are not appropriate for primary aged children as they do not have the wisdom needed to navigate these. We are finding that we are having to deal more and more during learning time with fallouts that have happened on chat groups in the evening or at the weekend.

Trust Appeal Fund

Following the Curriculum Evenings, we have sent out the information needed to sign-up for the Trust Appeal Fund. As all money raised by the PTA currently is going towards the final instalment of the 10% for the newbuild, this fund is going to be vital this year to ensure that our children are able to participate in many activities and have the materials that they need to complete tasks that cannot be supported by the school budget. When I last wrote we were having to use funds to pay for a new interactive whiteboard leaving £5,106.45 in the account. Every small contribution makes a huge difference to school life. Thank you to those who contribute and for your consideration of joining this fund.

World Mental Health Day

On Friday, we are marking World Mental Health Day. We invite children to wear the colour yellow and to bring in £1 for doing so. All donations will go to Young Minds.

Marking the day will remind us of the importance of positive mental health. In class, we will look at what we can do to ensure positive mental health and encourage conversations about mental health issues, breaking the stigma around this. This goes hand-in-hand with the work that we are currently doing in school around spirituality. In school, we are beginning to use the language:

In—helping us to ask big questions;

Out—helping us to feel a sense of awe and wonder;

Up—helping us to understand that there is something greater;

Around—helping us to feel known and loved.
